


Collier School

Over 14 million adolescents live with a mental health condition.





Nearly 50%
of students
diagnosed with
a mental illness
drop out of high
school.

At Collier, 95% of our students graduate High School.

Collier School is a state-approved, private, non-profit Middle School and High School for students whose needs cannot be met within the public school. Combined with a strong counseling component, students are prepared for college, technical/vocational schools, and full-time employment.

Collier Residential Program

Everyday, 2,383 youth are reported abused or neglected.



In 2019, nearly 424,000 youth lived without permanent families.

Less than 50% of these children were **reunified with their families**.



3 out of 4 Collier Residents are reunified with their families or successfully transition to independent living.

Collier Residential Program addresses the immediate needs for safe housing and food security for adolescent girls and young women who have survived trauma, abuse, or neglect while providing in-depth counseling and life skills training with the goal of reuniting with their family or transitioning to independent living.

Kateri Day Camp

More than 10 million children live in poverty which creates gaps in their cognitive skills and putting them at risk of hunger and homelessness, jeopardizing their health and ability to learn.



Less than 50% of children who live in poverty are ready for school at age 5.



2 out of 3 Campers improve their literacy skills over the summer.
